PE and Sports Premium Funding

For the academic year 2015/16 and this current academic year 2016/17 the school has received PE and Sports Premium Funding to promote and develop physical education and sports throughout the school and community for all children at St Oswald's Catholic Primary school.

In the academic year 2015/16 the school received in funding: £ 8,896

In the academic year 2015/16 the school spent: £9,160

This funding was used to purchase:

- Warrington Wolves
- Progressive Sports
- Padgate Tennis Club (Facilities and Coaching)
- New equipment and resources
- WBC PE & Sport SLA

The impact of the funding has:

- Raised the confidence and ability of the teaching staff to improve and deliver quality lessons
- Improved children's engagement, attainment and skill levels
- Promoted and raised the profile of PE and sports throughout the school and community
- Improved the assessment of PE
- Improved equipment and apparatus throughout the school
- Raised awareness, engagement and increased membership of local sports clubs, centres and activity and dance schools

For the academic year 2016/17 the school has received: £8,908

The school intends to fully spend the funding again on the promotion of sports and physical activities for all children.

Sports Premium and Overview

1. St Oswald's Catholic Primary School supports all of its Teachers and staff to ensure that there is efficient and effective training on delivering quality and outstanding PE and games.

The school's Management Team and the Sports Co-ordinator have been working closely together since September 2014 and continue to do so throughout this academic year 2016/17 to ensure that all staff feel confident, positive and clear on how to deliver PE throughout the school. The school continues this academic year 2016/17 to work with the Local Authority (LA), local sports clubs and sports foundations to help maintain and further develop the PE and sporting activities within the school.

Throughout 2016/17 we will continue to work closely with Livewire, Warrington Wolves, Progressive Sports and Padgate Tennis Club. All staff work with the coaches and together co-teach PE lessons.

The school has invested both time and money to enable the staff to work with the coaches and to provide quality CPD for all staff.

CPD has included and continues to include aspects of:

- Confidence of delivery
- Health and Safety within PE
- Teaching and learning points within PE
- Quality of delivery
- Lesson planning and sports games
- Differentiation within sports and PE
- Assessments and planning

In January 2015 the school introduced a new PE curriculum (Real PE) which we continue to use throughout this academic year. The school and LA have supported all staff members with introductory training for the programme and further with individual class support and guidance. This support continues this year 2016/17.

2. St Oswald's are committed to working with professional and quality providers to ensure that PE is engaging and developmental for all children.

LA – Livewire: After initial training from the LA in 2014 on the delivery of the Real PE scheme all staff continue to use the scheme which ensure a consistency throughout the school in the teaching and assessment of PE and sport.

Warrington Wolves Foundation: The school has worked closely with Warrington Wolves Foundation for the last three years and continues to do so this academic year 2016/17 to ensure that all children have access to quality physical activity and key physical development skills.

Both St Oswald's and Warrington Wolves staff teach aspects of the sessions which all children enjoy. The sessions are beneficial, enjoyable and fun and are fully inclusive.

Progressive Sports: Unstoppable Sports provided our main sports coach for the last two years, since September 2014 through to Summer 2016. This academic year we have changed our sports coach from Unstoppable Sports to Progressive Sports after a trial of the provision during the summer term 2016. Progressive Sports provide the school with a full day per week of CPD training for staff per week. As Unstoppable Sports did, Progressive Sports provide feedback, observations and resources for staff to help develop the school PE curriculum. The school works with the company as a consultant to help improve subject quality such as developing PE improvement plans and behaviour management. The sports coach helps to improve staff subject knowledge, PE improvement plans.

Padgate Tennis Club: In September 2015 the school established links with the local Tennis club and has continued to receive weekly Tennis coaching at the club for all Junior children and staff. The school is continuing this academic year to use the facilities and courts and employ the services of the professional coach once a week in the first autumn term and the summer term. The coach continues to work with class teachers on skill development and subject knowledge.

3. St Oswald's Catholic Primary School is committed to providing clubs and Out of School Learning Hours (OSLH) activities.

The school provides a minimum of 2 hours per week OSLH sports clubs to promote health, fitness and nutritional support. The following ran throughout 2015/16 and continue in this academic year 2016/17:

Rugby – Yearly basis (2015/16 & 2016/17)

Football – Yearly basis (2015/16 & 2016/17)

Gymnastics and Dance – Term basis (2015/16)

Multi skills – Term basis (2015/16 & 2016/17)

Netball – (2015/16 & 2016/17)

Judo – (2015/16 & 2016/17)

4. Engaging children in community after school clubs and extra in school activities.

The school endeavours to support all children in further activity and exercise in the community. Activities and sports clubs that the school supports, positively promotes and encourages the children to progress in are as follows:

Local Judo and Taekwondo – Local instructor has worked with the school (2015/16) and continues to work with us in 2016/17. The school actively helps to promote the club.

Dance – The children take part in dance activities in school and staff are aware of the children who go to a number of different local dance schools.

Warrington Warriors Swimming Team – A large number of children attend swimming lessons at local sports centres. The school actively promotes swimming awards and achievements weekly in school. Children in Key stage 2 use the local pools for curriculum swimming.

Local Football – A large number of children attend local football clubs. The school actively promotes football achievements weekly in school. A local football club use the school facilities out of school hours for their training and tournaments.

Padgate Tennis Club – Since establishing links with this local club in 2015, the school has promoted membership of the club and a number of children have joined the local club as a result.

5. St Oswald's Catholic Primary School ensures and provides training and payment for Midday Assistants to introduce playground games at breaks and lunchtimes.

The school has invested time and money in providing midday staff, teachers and teaching assistants with training for both lunchtime and breaks.

Playground leader programmes was introduced for our upper Key Stage 2 children in the school (2015/2016). This programme is to be re-introduced in the academic year 2016/17 to help them lead our younger Key Stage 1 children at playtime with fun and safe games.

Each year group has access to playground and sports equipment at school breaktimes.

6. The commitment for establishing a regular system to incorporate competition for all ages.

The Real PE programme that the school uses, incorporates competitive activities to the curriculum for each different age group

St Oswald's recognises the importance of having competition included within the school's sport and PE programme. The school regularly takes part in inter-school sports competitions and sports festivals arranged for Warrington schools. Improvement and achievement is always celebrated positively throughout the school community at school assemblies, parent assemblies and weekly school/community newsletters.

FUTURE IMPROVEMENTS 2016/17

- Further training for Mid-Day Assistants to improve playground games and activities
- Utilise the school website and newspaper to keep parents and the community updated on local activities and achievements.
- Update playground equipment in KS1 and KS2
- Purchase and improve large PE apparatus, benches and mats
- Develop PE leadership for a new member of staff
- Ensure additional training is in place for two new members of staff to the school (2016/17)
