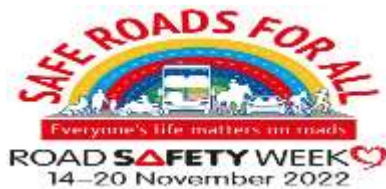


Year 5 Blog
